Report on the standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Standalone financial statements of M/s FOUNDATION OF ARTS FOR SOCIAL CHANGE IN INDIA (*"the Company"*) which comprises the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2019, the Statement of Income & Expenditure, and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2019, and Statement of Income & Expenditure and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.



responsibility of Management for the Standalone Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting Standards specified under section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate implementation and maintenance of accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibility for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements





Background

The Company, Foundation of Arts for Social Change in India ("The Company"), a not for profit company, within the meaning of Section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013, was incorporated on 15.02.2017 with the Registrar of Companies, vide Registration No. U55300DL2017NPL312980 pursuant to the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, the company has prepared these financial statements for a period of 12 months from 01st April, 2018 to 31st March 2019. The company has been incorporated to carry on the activity of social welfare.

Accounting Policies

The significant accounting policies followed by the company are stated as below:

- Basis of accounting**
The accounts of the company are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the mercantile system of accounting and materially comply with the mandatory Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.
- Gross Fixed Assets** are stated at the cost of acquisition including directly attributable expenses if any for bringing the assets to its working condition for the intended use.
- Depreciation**
Depreciation on Tangible Assets is provided on Straight Line Method (SLM) over the useful life of the assets as prescribed under Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.
Amortization of Intangible Assets is provided on Straight Line Method (SLM) over the useful life of the assets as prescribed under AS-26.
- All income and expenditure having a material bearing on the financial statements are recognized on accrual basis, unless otherwise stated.
- Preliminary and Preoperative Expenses**
Preliminary and preoperative Expenses are amortized over a period of 5 years after the commencement of commercial business of the company.

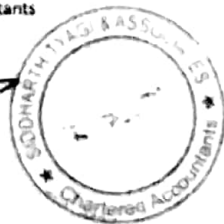


